Property Career Mentoring Program

The Property Career Mentoring Program supports property students and involves members of the profession in a mutually beneficial partnership.

Urban Renewal Field Trip

Organised excursions endeavour to demonstrate: new housing developments, refurbishment projects, heritage listed projects and green commercial buildings with emphasis on a sustainability framework setting targets in areas of water, energy waste, built form, transport and community.

Future Directions Young People in Property

Future Directions is a forum aimed at facilitating regular functions at which property students and alumni can learn, network and socialise.

Young People in Property (YPP) (Australian Property Institute (API))

The (YPP) scheme offers a platform for networking opportunities through a set of social and informational events (usually four times a year).

Industry Evenings Scheme

The Industry Evenings scheme offers career development seminars with a focus on the commercial and industrial property industry in SA and a fertile platform for networking.

Professional Body Information Sessions (Australian Property Institute (API))

The scheme offers informational sessions about the benefits of the professional accreditation and provides access for students to all Professional Development activities at substantially discounted, and in some cases, free rates.

Property Speed Networking Events

This event provides first year students the opportunity to meet with property practitioners from a wide range of industries and professions for short 'speed dating style' discussions. The aim of this event is to broaden students understanding of their employment prospects upon graduation.
