Honours is a unique opportunity to learn and develop your research skills, while also acquiring expertise in a specialist area. To support students during this intensive program, generous scholarships are available from the School of Commerce.

Scholarships

The School of Commerce offers up to six generous Honours scholarships, that are open to students enrolled in (or are considering admission into) the Bachelor of Business (Honours)/Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) program, with a research focus in any of the following disciplines:

- Commerce (Accounting)
- Applied Finance
- International Business/Market Regulation
- Property
- Business Administration

Scholarship Value: Up to six \$10,000 scholarships will be awarded each year.

Eligibility and Application Procedures:

To be eligible for the scholarship, students must study honours internally and submit their application to Alicia Foreman by the third Friday in December. The scholarships will be awarded to candidates considered most likely to succeed at producing research in the areas pertaining to the School of Commerce.

To apply, candidates are required to:

- be enrolled in (or be considering admission into) the Bachelor of Business (Honours)/Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) (DHBB) Program
- provide an essay of up to 1,000 words outlining the area of their proposed research topic

Selection Panel: Shortlisted candidates will be interviewed by a panel comprising:

- the Head of School (Commerce), or nominee, and
- two relevant academic staff members

Selection Interview: At the interview candidates may be invited to give a short presentation and may be asked to answer questions from the panel. The selection panel will consider the following:

- academic merit (GPA 5.0 or above)
- merit of the proposed research topic and
- communication skills

Scholarship Conditions:

- scholarship holders must be supervised by a relevant academic member from the School of Commerce
- scholarship holders who suspend their studies, may be asked to repay the scholarship

Other Awards and Scholarships:

The Centre for Regulation and Market Analysis (CRMA) offers two \$5,000 awards open to students enrolled in (or are considering admission into) the Bachelor of Business (Honours)/Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) program who wish to write their honours thesis on some aspect of market regulation.
