UniSA has a wide range of scholarships, so chances are there's one for you. Not only do scholarships provide financial assistance but they often include valuable work experience, mentoring opportunities and even overseas travel.

Examples include the Don Hawke Memorial Scholarship for rural students valued at up to \$125,000 over the duration of the recipient's program. The Codan 50th Anniversary Engineering Scholarship is valued at \$10,000 and Student Placement Grants, valued at \$1000, support professional experience placements.

These scholarships, plus many more, might just provide the helping hand you need to make university life a little easier.

## Indigenous students

### Gavin Wanganeen Indigenous Scholarship

**Value: \$5000 per year up to \$20,000**

Eligibility: Indigenous students enrolled full-time in an undergraduate degree program. Must demonstrate financial need, community activity and academic success.

### Irene and David Davy Scholarship for Advancement of Aboriginal Education

**Value: \$5000**

Eligibility: Indigenous students undertaking final or Honours year of study. Awarded on the basis of academic merit and community service.

## Students in financial need

### Resthaven 75th Anniversary Undergraduate Second Year Nursing Scholarship

**Value: \$5000 per year up to \$10,000**

Eligibility: Second year Bachelor of Nursing students with an interest in aged care who have chosen the aged care specialisation in the third year of their program. Must demonstrate financial need and academic merit, provide a personal written statement and attend an interview.

### Cowan International Placement Grant for Hawke Ambassadors

**Value: \$2500**

Eligibility: Third, fourth or fifth year students enrolled in specific programs who are undertaking a professional placement or internship as part of the Hawke Ambassador Program. Applicants must demonstrate financial hardship and meet the academic requirements for an international placement and UniSA Travel Grant.

## Rural and isolated students

### John and Johan Høj Rural Reconnect Scholarships

**Value: \$6000**

Eligibility: For students from rural and isolated areas to cover the relocation costs of moving to the city to pursue full-time study. Recipients selected on the basis of financial disadvantage, academic merit, a personal written statement and a character reference.

### The Pearce Family Transition Grants

**Value: \$2000**

Eligibility: Students commencing a full-time undergraduate teaching program who have experienced financial hardship and are required to move from designated rural areas to attend University. Applicants must demonstrate academic merit and financial disadvantage.

## High achieving students

### Ian Gould Experimental Science Scholarship

**Value: \$5000**

Eligibility: Honours or PhD students keen to undertake 'hands-on' research by actively engaging in experimental work and collecting and analysing their own data for thesis work in any area of science. Recipients are selected on academic merit, their research proposal, a reference from the research supervisor and performance at an interview.

### David Pank Northern Areas High Achiever Scholarship

**Value: \$2000 per year up to \$8000**

Eligibility: Financially disadvantaged, high achieving students from northern area high schools enrolled full-time in an undergraduate degree with a minimum ATAR score of 80.
