After a month, everything around us has become normal; the roosters at 5am, random goats that walk around everywhere, “Africa Time”, even the daily marriage proposals. I’ve been teaching English and sport for about two weeks now. The kids love sport because they don’t normally get to do it. English is great as well. The kids are all keen to learn. The school is very basic but serves its purpose most of the time. The other day, I was sitting in the classroom, and this goat made a frantic sprint from a door at one side to the other. That’s when you know you’re in Ghana.

I worked with the social workers and assisted with women’s self-help group meetings where we discussed things such as human rights and women’s rights. For me, to be able to make a kid’s life easier was the most important part. I learnt so much about myself and what I am capable of. I was able to give my time for nothing in return and enjoyed it.

The Golden Jubilee celebrations were something everyone was super excited about. We marched west with half the school chanting slogans in Nepali. It was a great way to see the complete area that Nirmal Pokhari (a village in Central Nepal) encompasses. As we headed back we also chatted with Imu, a nice teacher who invited us into his home. We accepted and were privileged to drink a cup of his own chiyaa (tea), which surprisingly tasted really nice. After surviving the whole walk home, it was great collapsing on the bench. It seriously does feel like home now, which is very cool.

THE SERIOUS STUFF

Obviously this option is a little unorthodox compared to living at home and having a part-time job for a year, but rest assured detailed measures have been taken to ensure your Gap Experience is as safe as it is fun. First off, it is compulsory for all Gap Experience students to complete a comprehensive training program designed to equip all students with all the practical skills they need. Further, no student goes alone. We send each student to their location in groups of between 5 and 15 other students. If you would like to be placed with a friend, this is also possible. There is 24-hour back-up and support for both students and parents in Australia and in-country. Most of the local towns have basic hospitals and for anything more major you will be taken to a city. You will be fully insured under your mandatory travel and medical policy.
