# Section 1: Review of Activities

## 1.1 The Foundation Inc.

The University of South Australia Foundation Inc. is the preferred giving channel for the University.

First established in 1992 after the formation of the University of South Australia in 1991, the Foundation seeks to attract and retain the continuing interest and financial support of the community, staff, alumni and friends of the University for the benefit of its education mission.

The Foundation Inc. is administered and supported by the University of South Australia through the Foundation Committee of Management. The University Development Board chaired by the Chancellor of the University, Mr. David Klingberg AM, assists in its fundraising activities.

The Foundation Inc. was again appreciative of the many members of the community who provided their own time to assist with fundraising and other corporate related activities. The Foundation is particularly grateful to the members of the Bequest Committee and in particular the Chairperson, Mr. Norton Jackson who again gave a great deal of his time to assist with bequest activities and who acts as master of ceremonies at the Successful Ageing seminars.

## 1.2 2003 Activities and Achievements

### Scholarships campaign

Commenced in 2000, the scholarships campaign continued with a particular focus on corporate named scholarships.

There are now a total of 17 named undergraduate scholarships at UniSA as a result of the scholarships campaign. New scholarship supporters in 2003 were:

### Transition Grants

For the third year, the University presented a set of Transition Grants. The grants were awarded to 25 students, making the transition to university. Thanks to the support of Mutual Community, 4 grants of \$2,500 each were awarded in the Health Science area. Five rural UniSA Transition grants of \$1,500 each, 10 metropolitan grants of \$1,000 each and 6 UniSA/Smith Family Scholarships valued at \$9,000 each were also awarded.

### Bequests

The remainder of the Peter William Stephens bequest was received during the year under review, as well as four new pledges.

### New Trusts

- > **Constance Gordon-Johnson**  
The Foundation was pleased to establish this new trust in 2003 to provide an annual grant for talented UniSA sculptors. Constance Gordon-Johnson was a well known South Australian sculptor, designer and teacher and the trust was made possible through her estate. The inaugural prize will be awarded in 2004.

### Special event activity

As part of its ongoing engagement with the community, the Development Board again undertook a range of special events:

- > **Chancellor's Challenge Golf Classic**  
The fourth annual charity golf day was held at the Kooyonga Golf Club. It was again an outstanding event and money raised was used to support High Achiever Scholarships to reward young South Australian students with outstanding academic ability. Over \$26,000 was raised from this event.
- > **Successful Ageing Seminars**  
As part of the University's Bequest Program, health and lifestyle seminars are held for the benefit of older people in the community. Aimed at the 55-year plus age group, these seminars give information about health and lifestyle issues. The speakers, who are able to give the latest information about research, are mainly sourced from within the University. Reflecting the community service ethos of the University and at the same time acting as an instrument to engage the community, the seminars showcased the expertise and the relevance of the University. Five seminars were held in 2003 - four metropolitan and one country seminars were held.

In 2003 the topics were:

- Planning your Finances
  - Stress and the Older Person
  - Medicines and your Lifestyle
  - Volunteering
  - Sleep Quality
- > **Blueprint and naming rights**  
A number of Chancellor lunches were held with key corporates to promote the University's Blueprint 2005 program which will see major capital development on its City West, City East, Magill and Mawson Lakes campus. The more than \$100m investment by the University in the State of South Australia will provide new amenity to students as well as consolidate the campus structure of the University. These lunches facilitated a number of naming rights opportunities that were still being considered at the conclusion of the year.

### 1.3 Trust Highlights

- > **Aboriginal Advancement League**  
The Aboriginal Advancement League annually awards Study Grants to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders. The study grants are awarded on grade point average to postgraduate students and medical students who are studying at either Flinders University or the University of South Australia. This year 3 grants of \$1,000 each and 2 grant of \$2,000 were awarded.
- > **Irene and David Davy Scholarship for Advancement of Aboriginal Education**  
This scholarship is awarded annually and is open to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students of the University of South Australia who are enrolled in the final year of an undergraduate course or who are honors students. The value of the scholarship value was increased in 2003 and two recipients received \$4,000
- > **The Bob Hawke Prime Ministerial Centre**  
The 20th Anniversary of Bob Hawke as Prime Minister in 2003 provided a very successful base for the Centre to increase its fundraising activities and results. The release of designs for the planned new 3A building on North Terrace, in which the Centre will be housed from 2007, was a further spur to engaging interest and commitment from a number of private donors.

The Bob Hawke Prime Ministerial Centre's donation receipts for 2003 amounted to \$257,150, enabling the Centre to achieve its first million dollars in largely untied personal donations.

Exposure for the Centre was again ensured through an active public program, including an exciting partnership arrangement with Adelaide Thinkers in Residence to co-present their Public Lecture series, commencing with Herbert Girardet's Making Adelaide a Green City. These have attracted audiences in excess of 1000. The sixth Annual Hawke Lecture was delivered by Gareth Evans, President of the International Crisis Group, and also attracted 1000 to the Adelaide Town Hall, and national media coverage. The on-line "interested persons" registrations for the Hawke Centre program increased to 1800 by the end of 2003. This registration process simultaneously brings an external audience into the University website and confirms the Centre's profile in the community.

In 2004 there will be increased effort to explore the potential of the new building for sponsorship arrangements. Director Elizabeth Ho is also developing the concept of the Civic Gallery, adjacent to the Art Museum and the Auditorium, as an important area in which to expose the contributions of UniSA to society at large, and to recognise donors to the Centre.

## 1.4 Foundation Committee of Management

The Committee of Management is responsible for the oversight of the policies and administration of funds held by the Foundation. The Committee of Management regularly reports to the University Council on Foundation activity.

Mr. Paul Beard, the University Executive Director Finance and Resources, is the Committee's chairperson.

The membership of the Foundation Committee of Management throughout 2003 was follows:

During the year following changes to University's management structures, Dr. Anna Ciccarelli was appointed as Acting Executive Director International and Development, replacing the portfolio held by Mr. Hender. The membership of the Foundation will be formally amended in 2004 to reflect this change.

The Committee is also grateful for the attendance at its meetings of Mr. Paul Ingram, who provides his services 'pro bono' as a representative of Minter Ellison, the University's legal representatives.

### > Communication

During 2003 the Marketing and Development Unit produced a newspaper flyer outlining Foundation activity, entitled 'Solid Foundations'. The newspaper was sent to donors and registered alumni and outlined the range of scholarships and University activities supported by the Foundation.

The Development Office also produced 'The Difference' a full colour, 10 page newsletter distributed to donors and friends of UniSA.



- > **Philanthropy guidelines**

In the middle of the year the University also endorsed a new set of guidelines for philanthropic activity - *University Philanthropy: Code of Practice*. The code builds on the Australian Vice Chancellors Committee philanthropy protocols and outlines staff and donor responsibilities and related University policies.

- > **Investment Policy**

As a result of the ongoing growth of the Foundation and reflecting a wish to ensure the long term growth of donor funds, the Foundation Committee of Management appointed Taylor Collison as its first funds manager during 2002. The Foundation has adopted an appropriately conservative investment position and actively monitors fund performance on a regular basis.
- > **University support**

The University of South Australia, through the Development Office within the Marketing and Development Unit (MDU), provided management and administrative support to the Foundation during 2003 at no cost. Funds raised by the Foundation are applied in full to the benefit of individual projects or activity.

## **NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2003**

### **1. Purpose**

The University of South Australia Foundation Incorporated (the Foundation) was established in April 1992 to assist the cause of education by providing support, both material and otherwise, to the University of South Australia (the University).

### **2. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies**

#### **(a) Basis of Preparation of the Financial Statements**

The accounts of the Foundation have been drawn up in accordance with the disclosure requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act, 1985. They have been prepared on an accrual basis and in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards as appropriate.

#### **(b) Economic Dependency**

The economic viability of the Foundation is dependent upon the continuing financial support of the University and on the Foundation's ability to attract and retain the continuing interest, financial support and assistance of the community in general, and of the staff, Alumni and other friends of the University. During the year the Foundation's operations utilised the services, facilities and staff of the University for nil consideration.

#### **(c) Income Tax**

The Foundation is an income tax-exempt body under the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997.

#### **(d) Subsidiaries**

The Foundation does not have any subsidiary entities.

#### **(e) Trust Funds**

The Foundation administers a range of donations and bequests from external parties. Administration of these funds is in accordance with the terms and conditions of receipt. Both the funds received and any earnings on investment are applied for the intended purpose.

**(f) Donations and Bequests**

Donations and bequests are recognized upon receipt of the funds. "Gifts in Kind" are not reflected in the financial statements.

**(g) Investments**

Investments (shares and managed funds) have been revalued as at 31 December 2003. Valuations are at market value and the adjustment in valuation has been taken as an increment to the Investment Revaluation Reserve (refer Note 9(a)).

**(h) Bob Hawke Prime Ministerial Centre**

The Foundation has received moneys in relation to the Bob Hawke Prime Ministerial Centre for the purpose of contributing to a University building to house the Centre. As at 31 December 2003, the Foundation held an amount of \$677,533. During 2003 an amount of \$340,000 was transferred to the University for this purpose and further monies will be transferred to the University as required (refer Note 4).





## **INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT**
