# Our members help save lives

In the last month, the Uni SA Golden Key chapter teamed up with the Red Cross to organise a blood drive. It was a great opportunity for people to get involved in a vitally important service. Donating blood is a very simple and rewarding experience and just one donation can help save three lives.

A group of first year pharmacy and laboratory medical students from City East, organised by Wen Qi Ng, a first year podiatry student, went to the Pirie Street donor centre to give blood on August 8.

The organised blood drive was a huge success with 20 people interested and 15 donating.

Winter is always a difficult time for the blood service, as many of the regular donors are

unable to give blood due to colds and flu, which is why it's important for new donors to come forward.

Every week Australia needs 21,000 donations to maintain an adequate blood supply and currently those targets are not being met.

Donating blood is easy and takes less than an hour. Almost anyone aged between 16 and 70 in reasonably good health is a potential blood donor.

# The truth about life in The Big Easy

International Conference - New Orleans

Bourbon Street, Mardi Gras and the birth-place of Jazz. Café Du Monde, Po Boys, Beignets and Gumbo. What comes to your mind when you think of New Orleans?

The Jazz capital and party town is well known for many things, but in August 2005, New Orleans became well known for a whole new reason.

Hurricane Katrina was one of the deadliest hurricanes America has ever seen. It ripped through the heart of Louisiana and reeked havoc all along the north central coast. New Orleans was hardest hit by the natural disaster, with many lives lost and extensive property damage.

Infrastructure malfunctions, in particular the failure of the federal flood protection system, resulted in the worst civil engineering disaster in United State's history. The system failure caused 80 per cent of the city to flood. Over 1,500 people died in the disaster and some are still unaccounted for.

That was three years ago though, and coming from Australia, I thought the problems Katrina caused had long been resolved. I was wrong.

From my first step into the state I realized that Katrina was not just a disaster but also an event that had become ingrained in these people's identity.

The taxi driver who drove us from the airport to the hotel, started what was to be a week of learning from first hand experiences. Everywhere we went Katrina was always at the forefront of conversation. Whether it was to point out the super dome, where all the people had stayed, their arrowhead symbols of hope that were everywhere or if it was simply people talking of their loss and frustration.

It was only logical that I should be curious as to what I would find, when we embarked upon the Golden Key organised service project on August 2.

Over 300 Golden Key Honour Society delegates from around the world spent several hours Saturday afternoon working with Beacon of Hope and cleaning up homes in the

ninth Ward district of New Orleans.

What I saw seemed impossible, the shell of houses gutted by the flood still standing empty, the water logged possession now forgotten. Among the overgrown gardens, empty houses and debris, re-established houses would stand, a glimmer of hope among the devastation and yet so out of place among the ruins.

From noon till five, we chopped, snipped, pulled, cut, packed, weeded, bagged and cleaned the abandon neighbourhood in the unbearable heat. By the end we were muddy, sweaty and dishevelled but the small difference we made put a smile on our sun burnt faces.

It seemed surreal that people from America, the world's superpower could be living like third world citizens, it made us question the government's priorities and reasoning. It wasn't hard to see the reason for conspiracies as to why the citizens of New Orleans had been abandoned.

It seemed almost unfathomable that such a large proportion of Americans could be living like this without it making front-page news. But I was constantly reminded that things had been this way for three years and who knew how much longer it would remain in this state.

Leaving New Orleans I saw a woman wearing a t-shirt. In bold letters the acronym FEMA was written, FEMA being the Federal Emergency Management Agency in charge of recovery efforts. However, instead of saying this, it read Fix Everything My Ass.

This summed up the sentiment felt in these neighbourhoods.

With so many citizens still displaced and living in FEMA trailers, it poses the question, how long till citizens of The Big Easy, can breath easy again?

Vanessa was awarded the New Member Scholarship worth \$100 and was pleasantly surprised when she found out she had won.

'I'm not exactly sure how I came to win it actually. Although at the new member induction ceremony when it was presented to me, I gathered it was because of the other awards and extracurricular activities that I had mentioned when I registered with Golden Key, since some of them were read out - lucky me.'

Vanessa said she didn't even know she was applying for the award or that there was a new member scholarship but advised that everyone should apply.

'I guess (I was awarded the scholarship) because I took the time to fill in my member profile when I registered...it takes no effort whatsoever. As long as you fill in all the fields when you register as a new member.'

Although Vanessa has now finished university she has still benefited from joining Golden Key. 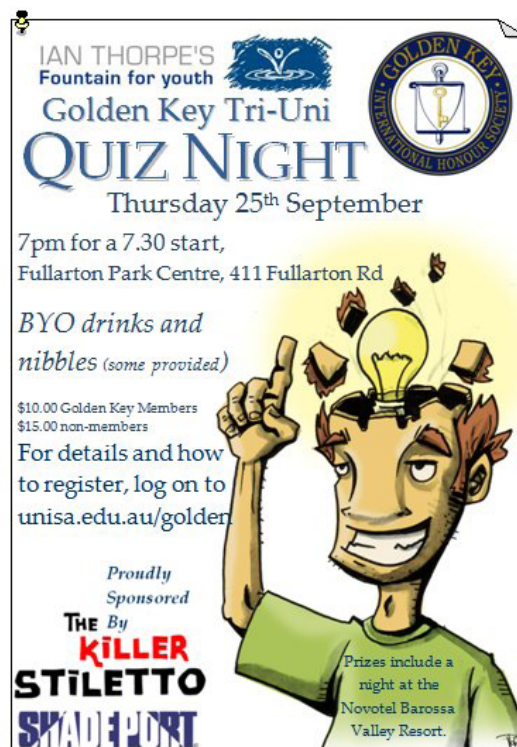
