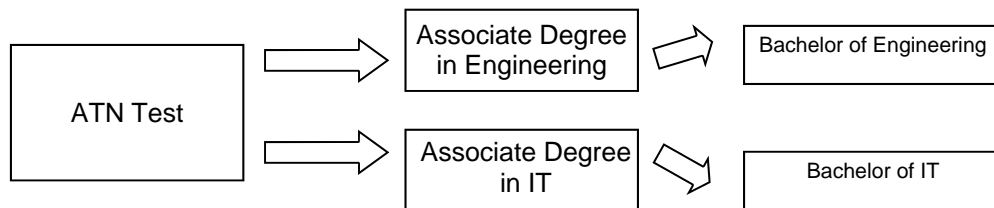




Australian Technology Network (ATN) Test Your pathway to a Bachelor of Engineering or IT degree

What is the ATN Test?

The ATN Test is a unique and innovative assessment test of a prospective student's aptitude and capability to undertake engineering or IT studies and become a qualified engineer or IT professional. The 2.5 hour multiple choice test assesses aptitude to think scientifically, solve quantitative problems, critically analyse information and display interpersonal understanding.

Developed and conducted by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER), the test is only offered by ATN Universities, UniSA being the only one in South Australia.

Satisfactory completion of the ATN Test allows direct entry into the Associate Degree in Engineering or IT. The Associate Degree is then a pathway into the Bachelor Degree.

Who should sit the test?

School students and mature age students who may not have the traditional year 12 maths and science background or the Tertiary Entrance Rank (TER) required for entry into a Bachelor of Engineering or the Bachelor of IT programs.

When is the Test?

Saturday 24th September 2011
