Entry requirements

A completed 4 year Bachelor degree (or Honours degree) from at a recognised higher education institution; or a completed Graduate Diploma in Project Management from UniSA

Study options

This program is offered internally only.

Do you have an undergraduate degree, or at least six years professional experience relevant to project management? If you want to enhance your project management capabilities and advance your career, then this program is for you.

Why Project Management?

Over the past two decades, the need for specialised Management of projects has been recognised in many industries, including information technology, construction, engineering, defence, finance, biopharmaceuticals, the arts and community development. The result of this is that project management has emerged as a highly valued and recognised discipline in its own right, with increasing usage across public and private organisations.

Project Management at UniSA is offered in the form of a nested suite of three programs at postgraduate level. Which program you choose to start on will depend upon your career needs, your previous level of academic qualification, and your previous professional experience.

What will I study?

The Master and Graduate Diploma provide programs of advanced study for the successful management of projects from a wide range of industries. Both programs require students to study eight core courses. In addition to the eight core courses, the Master requires students to develop and undertake an integrated research project. In some cases this project might focus on a real issue within their employment.

The eight core courses have been designed to inform and develop students with respect to the:

- nine project management knowledge areas and their related processes identified by the Project Management Institute in their publication 'A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge' 2004. The nine knowledge areas covered are integration, scope, time, cost, quality, human resource, communications, risk and procurement management,
- contemporary tools and techniques used by project managers for the efficient and successful management of projects and;
- importance of 'softer' skills – such as leadership, motivation, perception and dispute resolution – to project processes.

The Graduate Certificate offers students the opportunity to study four courses from the eight core courses offered to Master and Graduate Diploma students. Upon successful completion of the Graduate Certificate, students have the opportunity to progress on to the Graduate Diploma in Project Management and, eventually, the Master of Project Management.

Professional Recognition

The Master, Graduate Diploma and Graduate Certificate are endorsed by the Australian Institute of Project Management (AIPM). Graduates from the program are eligible to apply for appropriate membership.



Information for domestic students

Fees: This program is Commonwealth Supported. Fees for Commonwealth Supported Students are calculated at the course level.

Information for international students

Fees: \$AU24,000 per 1.0 EFTSL for students commencing in 2012.

Fees are calculated on a per Unit basis with 1.0 EFTSL = 36 Units. Fees for International students are determined one year in advance and are subject to variation.

English language requirements

International English Language Testing System (IELTS Academic): Minimum score of 6.0 in Reading and Writing subscores and minimum overall score of 6.5 obtained within the last two years or corresponding results from an equivalent test such as TOEFL or the appropriate Academic English language level delivered at CELUSA; or Successful completion of a tertiary qualification at diploma level or above completed in Australia within the last two years; or Successful completion of at least two years of tertiary study at diploma level or above conducted and completed in English within the last five years in a country in which English is commonly used, as determined by the University. Where the study in English was more than five years ago, this requirement may be satisfied by subsequent and recent work experience of two or more years duration in a setting where English is the language of business subject to satisfactory evidence as determined by the Program Director.

- Graduate Diploma students should normally hold an undergraduate degree
- Graduate Certificate students need to hold an undergraduate degree or demonstrate a minimum of 6 years relevant professional experience
