**DEFINITIONS:**

Area + Catalogue Number

A 4-letter area code plus a 4-digit catalogue number make up the course code, e.g. **BIOL 1033**. You can search for courses using this code.

Class Number

Every class at UniSA has a unique number (e.g. **24813**). Use this number to enrol. Both the **enrolment class** and **related classes** have class numbers.

Enrolment Class

This can be a **lecture (LEC)**, **tutorial (TUT)**, **workshop (WSH)** or **practical (PRA)**, to name a few examples. It is the first class you must enter when you are enrolling.

Related Classes  
(Non-Enrol Classes)

These are other required components of the course, and are in addition to the **enrolment class**. They can be one of the following class types - **lecture**, **tutorial**, **workshop** or **practical**, to name a few. In most cases you will have a choice (e.g. 1 tutorial to be chosen from 7). However, in some courses, once you select the **enrolment class** you are automatically enrolled (**auto-enrol**) in a related class (e.g. a particular tutorial or practical at a particular time).
