

Dear Teacher/Organiser

Thank you for arranging a visit to the Samstag Museum of Art with your students/group. To ensure that the experience is valuable and rewarding for both you and your students/group, please take a moment to read the following information.

Teachers and group leaders are responsible for their group throughout the visit. It is the role of the Samstag Museum to display and look after the art works for all to enjoy. As works of art can be easily damaged, groups must be supervised at all times. Before entering the exhibitions please advise your group of the following:

### Visiting the Galleries

- Please be considerate of other visitors to the gallery and noise levels
- Leave large bags and backpacks at the Samstag Museum reception before entering the exhibition
- NOT TO TOUCH any of the art works
- If the exhibition has lower light levels, please move carefully around the space
- No eating or drinking in the galleries
- No running

### Exhibition Talks

Museum staff are available to provide 5 minutes introductory talks for school groups of Museum exhibitions.

### Photography

Photography is generally not permitted in the exhibitions. Please ask Museum staff on arrival.

### Access

There is full access by lift to all floors. There is a wheelchair accessible toilet on the lower ground floor.

### Refreshments

Reasonably priced Campus cafes are located adjacent to the Samstag Museum.

### Opening Hours

Opening hours during exhibitions: Tuesday to Friday from 11 am – 5pm, Saturdays and Sundays 2 – 5pm or at other times by appointment. The Samstag Museum is closed on public holidays and during exhibition changeovers.

### Getting Here

The Samstag Museum is located in the Adelaide City West End. The West End precinct is home to the Lion Arts Centre, the Experimental Art Foundation, JamFactory Contemporary Craft and Design, Nexus Multicultural Arts Centre, Craftsouth Centre, BMGART and the SASA Gallery on Hindley Street.

Free City Loop buses (99C, stop 7) and trams (stop City West) to the UniSA City West campus and Lion Arts Centre operate every day.

Free trams operate from Victoria Square along King William Street and North Terrace to the Samstag Museum, UniSA City West campus/Lion Arts Centre terminus.
