Stroke and Activity Behaviour: Past and Future Research

Dr Trish Manns is an Associate Professor in the Department of Physical Therapy at the University of Alberta. Her research program focuses on health promotion strategies, including physical activity and exercise, for people with stroke. Primary outcomes of interest are functional ability and cardio-metabolic risk factors. Dr Manns teaches in the areas of neurology and health promotion in the physical therapy curriculum and is also interested in teaching methods and how they may or may not impact the evidence-based practice skills and behaviours of physical therapists in clinical practice.

Dr Manns graduated from the Physical Therapy program at the University of Saskatchewan and did most of her clinical physical therapy work in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. Her doctoral degree from Oregon State University was completed in the College of Health and Human Performance and she came to the Department of Physical Therapy at the University of Alberta in 2003.
