Progenitor cell migration and differentiation during vertebrate development

Dr Camp graduated with a PhD in developmental biology from the University of Adelaide in 2004. She is currently a Senior Research Associate in the School of Biological Sciences at the University of East Anglia, Norwich, UK. Prior to that she held a postdoctoral position at Prince Felipe Research Centre in Valencia, Spain where she studied the function of genes responsible for stem cell pluripotency and differentiation during early vertebrate development and in an in vitro stem cell model. Since moving to the UK in 2009, Dr Camp has been investigating the origin and migration of secondary heart field progenitors and the role of Wnt signalling in the migration and differentiation of heart precursor cells. In addition, Dr Camp has recently been awarded a grant as a Principal Investigator on a new project examining the role of microRNAs in cardiac progenitor cell differentiation. She will present a seminar on her stem cell research as well as a brief overview of her current results in the field of cardiac research.
