



## Construction Industry Training Board Design & Technology Scholarship

### INFORMATION AND APPLICATION FORM

#### The Construction Industry Training Board Design and Technology Scholarships

Doorways to Construction ([D2C](#)) is a Vocational Education and Training (VET) initiative set up by the Construction Industry Training Board ([CITB](#)) in conjunction with the secondary schooling sectors of South Australia. The programme is designed to assist secondary students to learn about the skills in the building and construction industry and gives them the opportunity to experience the various career pathways within the industry.

In an effort to support the recruitment of interested and skilled teachers for the delivery of the D2C programs, the Construction Industry Training Board Design and Technology Scholarships will provide funds to assist students with the cost of the student contribution amount for a Commonwealth supported place during the third and fourth year of the degree of Bachelor of Education (Design and Technology Education) at UniSA. The call for applications will be during November of the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the program. The value of the scholarship is 100% of the HECS payments for the third and fourth year of full-time study in the degree.

#### Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

- be enrolled full-time in the [Bachelor of Education \(Design and Technology Education\)](#) at UniSA
- be in their second year of study
- be an Australian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Australia
- maintain satisfactory progress within the program in each half year, as defined by university policy
- undertake the third-year and fourth-year practicum placements for the program in a secondary school setting which includes working directly with a D2C program
- participate in a range of building and construction industry activities organised by the CITB including and not limited to site visits and undertaking additional courses in the trades skills areas

Graduates of the Doorways 2 Construction program or a similar VET in school program, and persons with skills/work experience related to the Construction Industry are encouraged to apply.

Applicants need to show their interest in the construction industry and in teaching, and provide evidence of meeting the eligibility criteria.

The selection committee will include two representatives of the Construction Industry Training Board and one from UniSA School of Education. The selection committee may take into account:

- TER score
- Interest in and relevant experience related to the Construction industry, including previous study
- Willingness to participate in CITB-related activities.

#### Notes

- The total value of the scholarship will vary as HECS charges change over time and will be paid in instalments over the life of the degree program, to a maximum of 4 years equivalent full time. Three scholarships are offered.
- Scholarship payments will be subject to satisfactory academic progress in each year of study. During each year there will be a half yearly and end of year review.
- Scholarship payments will be made after the August 31 Census date for enrolment.
- The scholarship may be suspended for periods of leave according to University Policy A-9.6 Leave of Absence and Withdrawal from Coursework; however should a period of leave exceed 12 months, the scholarship will be terminated.
- Acceptance of the scholarship may put at risk eligibility for receipt of other scholarships (eg Smith Family Learning for Life Scholarship). It is the responsibility of the recipient to ensure eligibility requirements are met. This scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships.
- Scholarships may, in some instances, be counted as income against Youth Allowance or other forms of government assistance payments, so applicants should seek independent financial advice.
- The scholarship will not be offered if there are no suitable applicants.

### **Lodgement Details and Closing Dates**

As only one set of scholarships is available, it is important to include all relevant documentary evidence with the application. Failure to do so will mean that the application will not be considered.
