Learning and Teaching as Seeing and Showing: Engaging Students in the Reception and Making of Media

A seminar with Professor Marnie Hughes-Warrington, Pro Vice-Chancellor (Learning and Teaching), Monash University: Films rank second only to photographs as the means by which people claim to connect with the past. As has been highlighted in the ALTC scoping study 'Historical Thinking in Higher Education', however, few students make any connection between visual and new media and historical understanding. In this presentation, Marnie will talk about how she worked with students over a decade to transform assumptions that history was 'written document' discipline, and in the process formed collaborative partnerships with students and staff in media that changed her understanding of learning and teaching.
