Cowell the focus of oyster study

University of SA researcher Janine Pierce recently invited various Cowell community members to take part in a case study of "Oyster Communities on the Eyre Peninsula".

Participants were given a disposable camera, along with a 'photo voice diary' to write their opinion of the photograph, whether it was positive or negative.

The photos represented how the community perceives the oyster industry and what is desirable or needs changing.

When all photos were completed Janine and Professor Jennifer McKay, also from UniSA, held a PhotoVoice workshop at Turner's Aquaculture to tell the story of the impact of oyster aquaculture on Cowell as seen through the photo lens by the community.

This research is the last phase of data gathering of a research project conducted by the University of South Australia in conjunction with the Eyre Regional Development Board as an industry partner to assess social sustainability of oyster aquaculture on Eyre Peninsula.
